# COMMON HOA RULES AND REGULATIONS

Living in a community managed by a homeowners association (HOA) means that you're obligated to follow certain rules and regulations. These rules can be very particular and you may not even know you're doing something wrong! Below is a gentle reminder of some of our Beekman community covenants, conditions, and restrictions that, if not adhered to, could result in fines.

- <u>Changes to the appearance or structure to your home requires permission from the Board of Managers.</u> To preserve the value of both your unit as well as the other units in the community, ALL building exteriors and common areas should be consistently clean and uniform. NO ALTERATIONS OR CHANGES ARE PERMITTED TO THE OUTSIDE OF YOUR UNIT WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE BOARD OF MANAGERS!
- <u>Thinking of renting your home?</u> PLEASE REFER ANY QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS TO THE BUSINESS OFFICE!
- <u>Trash and recycling mandates are in place to help protect the community and the homeowners.</u> Your cooperation will result in a safe, clean community that maintains its property values. Improperly disposed trash might just invite that hungry skunk to stop by and finish off last week's chicken wings! It is unfair to now expect our maintenance crew to clean up and dispose of this unnecessary mess. **PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL TRASH IS SECURED AND COVERED APPROPRIATELY!**
- <u>Parking Spaces</u> Each unit is provided with two parking spaces for use by PASSENGER VEHICLES ONLY. In consideration of your neighbors, park in your designated spot and instruct visitors to use the spaces marked "Visitor". Please do not park one vehicle behind another as such "stacking" poses a safety hazard. A PROPERLY MANAGED PARKING SYSTEM NOT ONLY PREVENTS DISPUTES BUT ALSO IN-SURES SAFETY AND PROMOTES THE OVERALL LIVING EXPERIENCE!
- <u>Pet ownership is a privilege.</u> The most responsible thing pet owners can do for their family, community and environment is to make sure their pets are picked up after. Dog waste is NOT fertilizer for your lawn! Just one gram of dog waste can contain as many as 23 million fecal coliform bacteria. Dog fecal matter is a major contributor to stormwater pollution. The Center for Disease Control confirms that hookworms, ringworms, tapeworms and Salmonella can be spread by contact with infected dog waste. WHAT CAN YOU DO? PICK IT UP! ALWAYS!
- Dealing with homeowners disputes can be tricky. In an ideal world, condo living would be a perfect experience, never having to worry about conflict with our neighbors. However, disputes between neighbors do occasionally arise. Sometimes just a polite conversation is often the most simple resolution. When a problem is just a neighbor-to-neighbor dispute, the Board of Managers is not required to intervene. In a more doubtful or uncertain case, the Board will do its best to investigate the nature of the behavior before making a decision to act or not. UNLESS THE DISPUTE AFFECTS THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE, THE BOARD WILL REVIEW THE BY-LAWS TO DETERMINE WHAT ACTION NEEDS TO BE TAKEN!

## WHAT TO DO IF YOUR HOA SAYS YOU BROKE A RULE

- <u>Address it:</u> Ignoring an HOA rule violation won't make it go away, and can actually make the situation much worse. If you've received a violation warning, take steps to understand and correct the situation.
- **Don't take it personally:** Remember, the HOA rules were created to keep the community safe and comfortable for residents, including you. You agreed to abide by the rules when you bought your home.
- **Communicate:** While friendly face-to-face communication can address minor infractions or warnings, written communication and documentation helps create clarity for everyone involved. It's best to address it in writing. If there are extenuating circumstances, possibly an exception can be made. You won't know, unless you ask!
- <u>Get Involved:</u> "There is usually a correlation between the level of homeowner involvement and the longterm success of a community." So, if you want to improve your community, volunteer for a board position or attend meetings to see how you can contribute!

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**Cone Call Now** is a system that allows organizations to easily send important messages via voice, text and mobile app, with just one click or call. Beekman Place Estates uses this service to notify owners of important communications, such as emergency response, holiday trash reminders, etc. The system allows targeted alerts to ensure the right people get accurate information quickly. Messages are generated through the Beekman Office telephone number (413-786-9710) which will appear in your caller ID. When you see this number come up on your phone or television, please listen to the entire message. It is not necessary to return a call to the Business Office. All of the information will be recorded on your voicemail.
